The deployment of an MPLS core network provides the council with secure, reliable network services that allow personnel to communicate and access services and information on a 24/7 basis, whatever their location.

Challenge

Rugby Borough Council is a local government district in eastern Warwickshire, West Midlands.

It delivers services to the town of Rugby where the council has its headquarters, and the rural areas surrounding the town

Rugby is expecting an economic boost in the shape of tourism and start-up businesses increase for the New Year.

With a population of over 91,000 and an exciting year 2017 coming its way, the borough was starting to realise the limitations of its existing point-to-point infrastructure.

Needing to update its ageing core IT infrastructure whilst ensuring continuity of service and reducing operational costs, the challenge was to build a single high-speed network linking the main town hall office to 6 other council sites.

Faced with budgetary challenges from public sector spending cuts, the authority needed a cost effective and compliant solution in place.

Solution

Rugby Borough Council selected hSo, an official RM1045 lot 1 vendor, as its preferred supplier to design, deploy and manage a new high-performance network to replace the point-to-point setup across the borough.

hSo worked with Rugby to ensure that the new network would meet all the needs of the Borough Council and providing a scalable core with built-in flexibility for future expansion.

The hSo managed MPLS solution is based on fibre leased lines, offering a highly available and scalable network for mission-critical business applications. With high bandwidth (up to 200Mb) accessible, Internet is accessed from the cloud, delivered over the WAN, and shared between the 7 sites. A managed firewall hosted in the cloud is protecting all of the borough's sites.

Furthermore, end-to-end QoS (Quality of Service) was integrated to convert their existing PBXs to SIP, routing traditional voice lines over the MPLS network and enabling prioritisation of VoIP traffic over data transfer when necessary.

Proactive 24/7 network monitoring and management is provided by hSo's UK-based NOC (Network Operations Centre).

The hSo solution has placed the authority on a foundation for growth in support of its strategic commitments to the community. Being the most economically advantageous not only achieved cost savings, but importantly brought more value to Rugby. With high bandwidth accessible (up to 200Mb), it now has the means to transform itself and deliver excellent services to its residents and the community.

The solution will give them the availability to be more resilient and to back up all of their data to another site, beside Town Hall.

Moving to SIP trunks gives the borough and its employees greater control and reliability while reducing costs.
